- City Hall On The Move – The series of moves in City Hall that will result in easier citizen access to services, enhanced security, placement of internal, support services at the rear of the building and restoration of the walk-around Avery Galley has begun. If you go into Roberta’s old office with a personnel issue, you’ll encounter Kurt instead, who will start talking you into investing in Seaside. More to follow, in sequence, through August and September. Anyone want a 4’x8’ tan and lavender Resource Management Services sign?

📄 Council Chambers Packed – A study session on potential future uses of Cutino Park brings a terrific collection of parents, grandparents, kids and coaches to City Hall to advocate for more / better fields to play on. Here’s four relatively simple fixes, as we plan ahead for recreation and open space facilities on former Fort Ord property:

#1 – Bring a plan for multi-use, multi-sport artificial turf at Cutino Park back to the City Council before the year is out. Leverage grants, user-fees and low interest rates to invest in the park, and multiply its usage.

#2 – Open discussions with MPUSD to jointly build / improve soccer fields at / near the Middle School.

#3 - Bit of a mind-expander this next one. There are multiple parcels waiting for development (Surplus II, Golf Course, etc.). Make deals with the prospective developers to grade development-ready pads, plant turf as a cover crop and get some public use benefit out of the parcels while other Fort Ord / CSUMB rec assets come on-line.

#4 - Swap out the “no soccer here” trees at Laguna Grande Park for planters we can move in and out of position to manage turf usage that could include limited soccer.

#5 – Some turf covered barges in the bay or Roberts Lake? Probably cost-prohibitive at the scale of soccer. But I do recall a skatepark barge visited Davenport once. It was incredibly cool.

The point being – **imagination and will are the only two things that hold any community back.** So let’s be imaginative, and willful.

### **Which Brings Me To**

📄 Strategic Planning Tuesday – The City Council and department heads will get together Tuesday, at the Oldemeyer Center for a strategic planning retreat. Show up at 8:00 a.m. for the best selection of donuts or whatever will be there to fuel us. The agenda is attached.

What should really fuel us is imagination and will. The preceding six-month “grid” is also attached. Let’s dream bigger than six months. Let’s clear the path for investment, jobs and quality of life improvements. And let’s not be tentative about making strides in pursuit of our goals, and investing in our city, ourselves.
