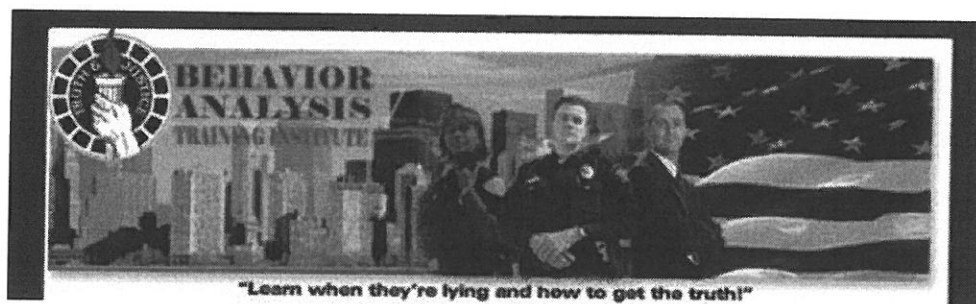
Advanced Animal Law Enforcement Academy

Course Description:	This is an intensive 40-hour study of advanced investigative techniques as they relate to the enforcement of California anti-cruelty and neglect laws. Students should be prepared to conduct a mock investigation, take photographs (bring your own camera), write reports, collect evidence, work collaboratively with a team, and testify. Students will be asked to report on an agency investigation or animal issue.
