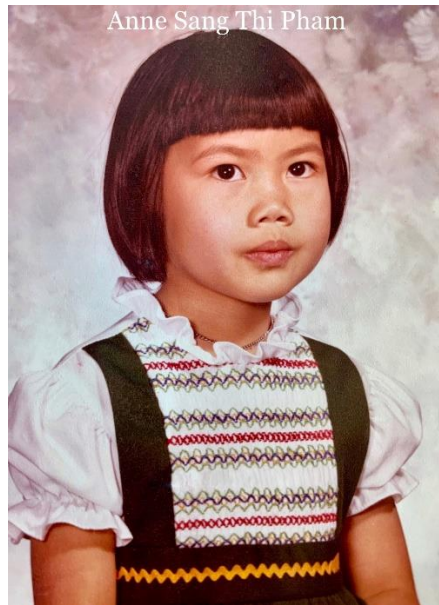

## Cold Case Reopened



On January 21, 1982, five-year old Anne Pham left her home in Seaside and walked to her kindergarten class at Highland Elementary School, a couple of blocks away. Pham never arrived at school. Two days later, Army CID investigators found Pham's body in the former Fort Ord area. She had been sexually assaulted and murdered. Pham was known as a shy and sensitive child.

The Pham family had fled Vietnam in a fishing vessel in 1975. They were eventually caught by the US Navy and brought to Seaside to start a new life. Pham was one of ten children.

The case was investigated by Seaside PD and the FBI and the case eventually went cold. New leads have surfaced in recent time and the case has officially been reopened.

Seaside PD has formally partnered with the Monterey County District Attorney's Office Cold Case Task Force in an effort to look into the case further.
