 **Fireworks Town Hall** – Council-members Pacheco and Campbell are hosting a Town Hall meeting to discuss fireworks Tuesday, August 15 at the Oldemeyer Center, starting at 6:30 PM. If you have concerns or suggestions, please stop by. The Town Hall meeting will be followed up with a City Council Study Session on the topic on September 7, at 5:30 PM.

This is just a starting point, but the City Council has budgeted money for a community fireworks display in 2018, and the Black Horse / Bayonet Golf Course has agreed to host the display. Thousands of people could go, enjoy a safe and professional fireworks display, and non-profits could fund-raise with food and beverage sales. That model – or something similar – works in many other places.

 **Better Living Through Sun, Math & Carpet** – By the end of the day, the City will have two new Requests For Proposals (RFPs) and one bid available for potential contractors to respond to. There's a solar energy project for City Hall RFP, a bid for new carpet for City Hall and a joint RFP with the City of Marina for an independent fiscal analysis of municipal fiscal liabilities and revenue sources available under multiple FORA sunset or extension scenarios, all in the final stages of formatting. - ▣ Upcoming Study Sessions – We’re trying to move the second Police Body Cams Study Session forward in the schedule, to move everything else forward too. Watch next week for whether we’re successful in moving the Body Cams Study Session to Wednesday, August 23, followed by a closed session on a land sale matter.

If so, we’ll try to slide Short Term Rentals forward to Sept. 7. If Aug. 23 doesn’t work schedule-wise for everyone it has to work for (schedule-wise), then we’re back to Sept. 7 for Body Cams and Sept. 21 for Short-Term Rentals.

So far, it looks like the Water Study Session will be Oct. 19.

All the above, to be finalized ...

- ▣ Aug. 23, Definitely – The Planning Commission will take up their formal review of the Cannabis Ordinance, which specifies the zoning and licensing regulations for cannabis businesses. If moved forward by the Planning Commission, the ordinance will head to the City Council for review in September.

- ▣ Aug. 17, Definitely – The City Council agenda for Thursday, Aug. 17 includes:

- “Nurses Barracks” Proposals – The City has received two unsolicited proposals for redevelopment of the former Fort Ord “Nurses Barracks”. While appreciating the interest by investors in the potential re-use of the parcels (which have yet to be transferred to the City) at the 5:30 meeting, staff’s recommendation is going to be to issue a Request For Proposals for a larger parcel, to include the Nurses Barracks, after the Oak Woodland Study (currently in progress through a FORA contract) is completed. That way, the City can optimize the use of the larger parcel surrounding the old buildings, while integrating the planning with the (at long last) resolved tree preservation plan required by the Base Re-Use Plan. The Oak Woodland plan should be done by the end of the calendar year.
- Youth Fund requests for the Seaside football team and Del Monte Manor playground effort, and a fee waiver request for the Seaside HS homecoming parade.
- Traffic Committee recommendations for some red curb on Kimball for site distance purposes.
- Five Trucks for Public Works – And not one of them a Ford Raptor or Jeep, so I’ll be boycotting the meeting*

- Resolution approving a Capital Improvement Program for Measure X funds, and a name change for the MRWPC to become “Monterey One Water” (hey, they worked a vowel into the acronym).
- Requesting the Parks & Recreation Commission to provide recommendations on the allocation of \$150,000 of budgeted funds for park / open space improvements.
- * Actually, I’ll be heading back from a few days at Yosemite with my son. Chief Dempsey will serve in my stead at the meeting.

- Current Week’s Activities: MPE completed rough grading and constructed storm drainage structures (manholes and inlets) at the Alhambra St intersection. Alhambra St intersection will open by Friday (8/11) and it is anticipated that the Calaveras St intersection will be closed for installation of drainage structures. MPE has a crew of 4 laborers/operators/foreman this week.
- Next Week’s Schedule: MPE will continue installation of drainage structures on Calaveras working their way to Fremont Boulevard.
