

Mayor Glen Olea

Glen Olea was the 10th Mayor of Seaside. Mayor Olea first became interested in Seaside government after moving here in 1962.

In 1963 he was appointed to the Parks and Recreation committee by Mayor Beauford T. Anderson. He was also appointed as a member of the Planning Commission. In 1971 he was elected to the City Council. During his time as a Councilman he worked with Mayor B.J. Dolan Jr., Mayor Oscar Lawson and Mayor Stephan Ross.

Mayor Olea was elected as Mayor of Seaside in 1980. As Mayor he created the following commissions and program:

Historical Commission
Human Relations and Youth Group
Neighborhood Watch Program

Throughout his term of office Mayor Olea recognized all new businesses in the City with a ribbon cutting ceremony. Though new businesses are no longer honoring this ceremony, however, the Chamber of Commerce is continuing Mayor Olea's idea of recognizing new businesses by placing grand opening banners over the storefront of each new business.
