

Mayor Louis Haddad

Mayor Louis Haddad began his service with the City of Seaside in 1961 as a member of Mayor Beauford T. Anderson's Mayor's Advisory Committee. In 1964 he was elected to the City Council. Mayor Haddad served two terms as Mayor. He was first elected in 1966 and again in 1970.

The City of Seaside experienced rapid growth and political turmoil during his tenure. The 1960's was a time of local as well as national unrest, but Mayor Haddad steadfastly pursued ways to alleviate and solve many of the problems the City was experiencing.

Mayor Haddad's administration was involved in many important and long reaching projects which included the present City Hall, the present Seaside Library and present Post Office sites, the location of the Department of Motor Vehicles, the elimination of septic tanks and paving of City streets. He also effectively brought about the development of the portions of Fort Ord to increase tax revenue for the City, construction of senior citizens and low income housing, and the first plans for the Laguna Grande redevelopment area and the Kmart site.

Mayor Haddad now resides in the City of Monterey with his wife.
